Job Responsibilities:

- 2. Organize and host annual staff training about trauma-informed schools model for all staff.
- 3. Organize and host three conferences (every four months) for the community about trauma, its effects, and community resources to respond to trauma.
- 4. Successfully support the implementation and administration of the Project AWARE project plan and achieve operational objectives to ensure the flawless execution of all program activities.
- 5. Support the development and implementation a detailed project plan to monitor and track progress using appropriate tools and techniques (including creation and maintenance of comprehensive project documentation).
- 6. Coordinate and schedule activities and schedules of project staff at school site, including on call response to crisis situations.
- 7. Provide customer service to resolve problems and ensure high-quality program implementation.
- 8. Determine process and project improvements.
- 9. Create and maintain comprehensive project documentation.
